Important updates regarding road safety in proximity to our schools! The following roads surrounding the Hallsville School District will be officially designated as "School Zones" from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on days when school is in session. This initiative aims to enhance safety for students and community members. Please be aware that traffic violations occurring during posted school zone hours will incur double fines.

The roads designated as school zones include:

- Wesley Ave: From Highway 124-E to North Street
- Bertie Ave: From Highway 124-E to North Street
- Elaine Ave: From Highway 124-E to North Street
- North Street/Ricketts Road: From Bertie Ave to Tayler Court
- Hudson Ave: From Highway 124-E to State Route B
- Brown Ave: From Highway 124-E to Hudson Ave
- Additionally, the following road will be included in the school zone while maintaining its current posted speed limit: Highway 124: From State Route OO to the Hallsville Primary School driveway



Furthermore, Ricketts Road will enforce a speed limit of **15 mph** from North Street to Route U. Parking regulations on Ricketts Road will stipulate **"No Parking Anytime, Except for School Pick-Up and Drop-Off."** Vehicles parked in violation of this regulation will be subject to towing. This policy applies to both sides of Ricketts Road from North Street to Allison Industrial Drive. All changes will take effect on <u>January 13, 2025</u>, and new traffic signs will be installed accordingly.
