Whiteside, is retiring. We have started the process to engage a new city attorney. Lastly, Representative Reisch filed <u>HB1731</u> which authorizes the City to levy a sales tax dedicated to public safety, upon voter approval. These are a few of many things that

Only plastic, metal, and aluminum containers will be accepted for curbside recycling. Our recycling material is processed by the City of Columbia which uses a <u>dual-stream system</u> for containers and fiber on separate lines. Our trash contractor, Dayne's Waste, doesn't have collection vehicles to pick up recycling material separated for the dual-stream system. Therefore, paper, cardboard, and other fiber material will no longer be accepted in curbside recycling starting January 17, 2020.

Trash pick-up is Wednesday and should be set out at curbside the night before.

No yard waste or brush is allowed in your trash

collection.

Dayne's will pick up trash on all holidays except Christmas Day.

Recycling Information



recycling bags. No cardboard, paper, magazines, or any other fiber items will be accepted for recycling. The recycling processing center will no longer sort. If there is paper or cardboard in your recycling bags, they will **not** be picked up starting January 17th. Curbside pickup of recycling is every Friday. All recycling bags must be at curbside the night *before*. Recyclables must be bagged in the clear plastic bags that are provided by the City. Paper, magazines and cardboard can be recycled at the recycling bin located at the Community Center.

Bulky Trash Information

Starting in February bulky trash day will no longer be the last Wednesday of the month. It will start being the 3^{rd} Wednesday of the month. Bulky trash items include furniture, stoves, washing machines, water tanks, and other sizable waste materials that two men can lift. Refrigerators, ice makers, freezers, and window air conditioners need a certificate from a technician certifying removal of Freon from the appliance. No construction debris will be picked up.

Trash Rates

On your utility bill due February 10th your trash rates will go from \$14.75 a month to \$15.05 a month due to an increase in rates from Dayne's Waste Disposal.

All customer service calls, including missed trash, renting a dumpster, setting up or changing service, is handled by City Hall staff at 573-696-3885.

Do you know when to call **311** or **911**? Call **311** for all non-emergencies and call **911** for

emergencies! **DO NOT** leave a message at the Police Department. The phone messages are not

checked if they are out on patrol. **DO NOT** call City Hall if you need an officer as they can't always get in touch with an officer as fast as **311** or **911** can.

ACH Payments



The City also offers Automatic payment. The City will automatically withdrawal the City utility bill amount from your bank account on the 10^{th} day of each month. This will help to avoid late fees that are posted on the

11th. You will continue to receive your monthly statement showing the amount due and your bill will state 'DO NOT PAY'. Come into City Hall to get an ACH application or call to have one emailed or faxed to you.

Park Board



Ever thought of serving on the Park Board? The Hallsville Park Board is made up of 9 citizens. It currently has 4 members and 3 volunteers so there are 5 vacancies. If you are not a resident

within the city limits of Hallsville, you can be a volunteer on the Park Board. Applications are accepted throughout the year by the City Administrator and appointments are made by the Mayor with the consent of the Board of Aldermen. Currently the Park Board coordinates and hosts the annual Easter Egg Hunt and the annual 'Trick or Treat' in the Park. Last year they held a 'Movie in the Park and Food Truck Festival'. They would love to hold more activities in the Park and with more members or volunteers it would make that possible. Recent Ordinances Passed

The newsletter will spotlight ordinances passed each quarter. **Bill#2019-17/Ordinance 371** An ordinance annexing the property located at 14640 N. Ricketts Road was passed on November 20, 2019. **Bill#2019-18/Ordinance 372** An ordinance declaring the results of the election held November 5, 2019 (136 Yes - 64 No) was passed November 20, 2019. **Bill#2019-18/Ordinance 373** An ordinance entering into a contract for residential and commercial solid waste collection with Dayne's Waste Disposal for another year passed December 9, 2019. **Bill#2019-19/Ordinance 374** An ordinance repealing and replacing Section 230.100 (A) Trash Service Charges changing the trash rates from \$14.75 to \$15.05 a month passed December 9, 2019.
