MEET YOUR PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT



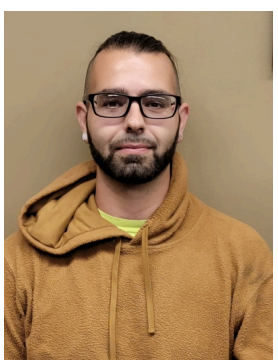
Public Works Superintendent Daniel McCaleb

Funds Community Services Generates Local Revenue
NOT a Double Tax!

*Proposition U will be on

- A Use Tax is a tax on the purchase of goods by Missouri residents from out-of-state vendors. Products exempt from the sales tax would be exempt from the Use Tax.
- If you already pay local sales tax on the purchase, you will **NOT** pay a Use Tax on the same purchase.
- The local Use Tax produces local funds for community services.
- Funds generated will help pay for expenses in General Revenue such as the Historical Society grounds upkeep, the Community Center, streets, Public Works equipment, and equipment and vehicle repairs.

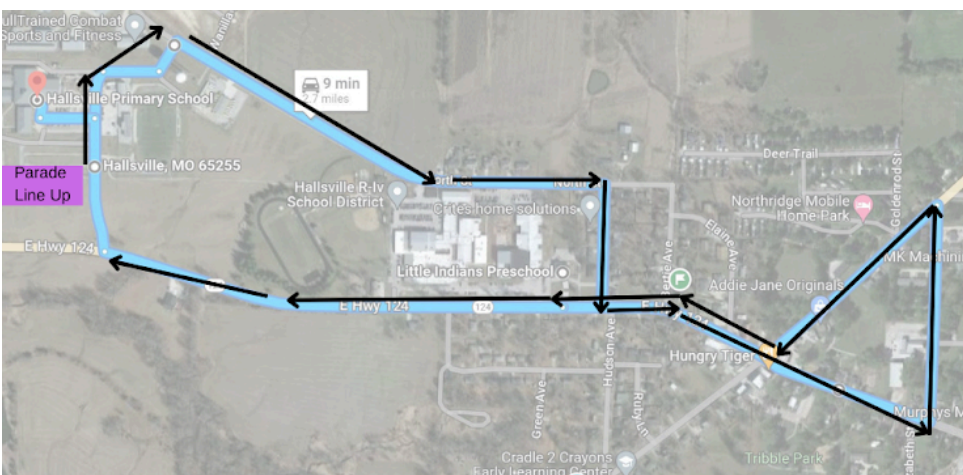
Police Foundation of Hallsville
